Diagnostic Radiological Technologist

The Diagnostic Radiological Technologist series covers positions requiring the performance or supervision of diagnostic radiologic examinations performed under the direction of a physician. The work involves the operation of radiologic equipment in a hospital or clinic environment as part of the diagnostic plan for patients. Positions include:

General Health Science


The General Health Science series covers positions that involve health-oriented research or other professional and scientific work that is generalized and cannot be classified in another series. Professional training in a health science or allied science field is required to develop the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the work associated with the series. Such work may cut across and require understanding of scientific methods and techniques common to several recognized health fields. Jobs may also represent an emerging or miscellaneous area not readily identifiable with an established series used to classify health, medical or allied science positions. Positions include:


